Changes to Wyoming wattsmart Homes Program

Light Emitting Diode (LED) technology has become the predominant lighting technology in energy efficiency projects. Long lamp life, reduced lifetime maintenance costs, absence of hazardous materials, controllability, higher efficacy, and decreasing costs relative to traditional technologies have contributed to a shift toward using LED products. To address the continuing and rapid shift to more efficient LED technologies, the Company is retiring incentives for Compact Fluorescent Lamps (CFL) effective May 22, 2017, pursuant to the process for “up to” amounts established in Docket No. 20000-500-ET-16.
